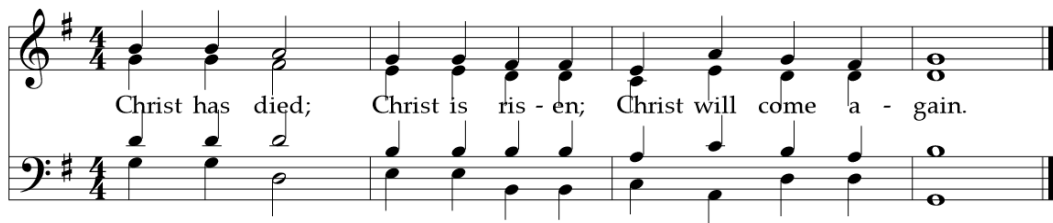
The Prayer of Consecration

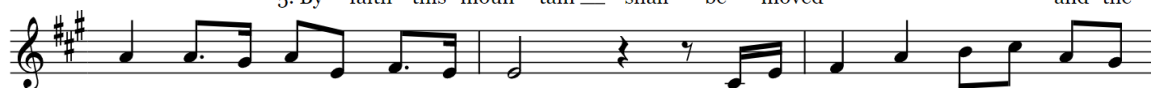




