The Consecration and Dedication of a Place of Worship

The people gather outside the building at the entrance of the sanctuary.

The Bishop says

Through the ages, Almighty God has moved his people to build houses of prayer and praise, and to set apart places for the ministry of his holy Word and Sacraments. With gratitude for the acquisition of Church of the Good Shepherd, we are now gathered to consecrate and dedicate it in God's Name.

Let us pray.

O Eternal God, mighty in power, of majesty incomprehensible, whom the heavens cannot contain, much less the walls of temples made with hands: You have graciously promised your holy presence wherever two or three of your faithful servants gather together in the Name of your Son. Be present with us who now come with humility and gratitude to consecrate this place to the honor of your great Name. We dedicate it to the work of your kingdom, separating it from all profane use: for reading your most holy Word, for celebrating your holy Sacraments, for offering to your glorious majesty the sacrifice of prayer and thanksgiving, for the blessing of your people, and for the mission of your Church. Accept, O Lord, this service at our hands, and fill this place with your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. **Amen.**

The clergy and people enter the Church. Standing at the door of the church, the Bishop knocks three times on the door with his pastoral staff, saying

Lift up your heads, O you gates, and be lifted up, you everlasting doors, and the King of glory shall come in.

People Who is the King of glory? It is the Lord, strong and mighty, even the Lord, mighty in battle. The Lord of hosts, he is the King of glory.

Psalm 24:7-8,10

The doors are opened by the Rector and Wardens.

With the pastoral staff, the Bishop marks the threshold with the sign of the cross of Christ, saying

Peace be to this house and to all who enter here: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Here the Bishop may use the Oil of Exorcism.

May our Lord Jesus Christ put his seal upon this place and protect it from all evil and darkness, that it may be a beacon of his truth and love.

The Processional

For All the Saints

The people stand, if able, and sing facing the procession



The Congregation remains standing, the Bishop begins the Prayer for the Consecration of the Church

Everliving Father, watchful and caring, our source and our end: All that we are and all that we have is yours. Hear us now, as we dedicate this place to which we come to praise your Name, to ask your forgiveness, to know your healing power, to hear your Word, and to be nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son. Be present always to guide and to judge, to illumine and to bless your people.

A Warden or other representative of the Congregation continues

Lord Jesus Christ, make this a temple of your presence and a house of prayer. Be always near us when we seek you in this place. Draw us to yourself to find comfort and wisdom, to be supported and strengthened, and to rejoice and give thanks. Grant, Lord Christ, that here we may be united with you and with one another, so that our lives may be sustained and sanctified for your service.

The Rector or Minister in charge continues

Holy Spirit, open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts, that we may grow closer to you through joy and through suffering. Be with us in the fullness of your power as new members are added to God's household, as we grow in grace through the years, when we are joined in Holy Matrimony, when we turn to you in sickness or special need, and, at the last, when we are committed into the Father's hands.

The Bishop pronounces the Sentence of Consecration, in this or some other form

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, Julian, by divine grace Bishop of The Anglican Diocese of the Living Word, by virtue of the spiritual authority entrusted to me, now therefore consecrate this Place of Worship, setting it apart from unhallowed and profane use, and dedicating it to Almighty God for the ministration of his holy Word and Sacraments, for building up the Body of Christ, for the mission of the Church, and for public worship according to the rites and ceremonies of the Anglican Church in North America.

All gathered respond, saying

Amen.

The Pulpit

The Bishop goes to the pulpit, lays a hand upon it, and says

Father, in every age you have spoken through the voices of prophets, pastors, and teachers. Purify the lives and the lips of those who speak here, that the Gospel of Christ may be boldly and faithfully proclaimed, for the building up of your Church and the extension of your kingdom.

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart

People Be always acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer.

Psalm 19:14

We dedicate this pulpit in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Holy Table

The Bishop proceeds to the altar, and says

Father, on the night that he was betrayed, your Son Jesus Christ instituted for us the banquet of our salvation. Accept here our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, in union with the one perfect sacrifice of your Son. Grant that all who eat and drink at this Holy Table may be fed and refreshed by the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. May they come with penitent hearts, lively faith, and perfect charity; and, being filled with your grace and heavenly benediction, obtain remission of their sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life,

People And I will raise him up on the last day.

Iohn 6:54

The Bishop lays a hand upon the Holy Table, and continues

We dedicate and consecrate this Table in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. May it be to us a sign of the heavenly Altar where your saints and angels praise you for ever. **Amen.**

The Bishop concludes the acts of Consecration and Dedication saying

O God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, sanctify this place;

People For everything in heaven and on earth is yours.

Bishop Yours is the kingdom, O Lord;

People And you are exalted as head above all. Amen. 1 Chronicles 29:11

The Acclamation and Collect for Purity

The people remain standing

Celebrant Blessed be God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.People And blessed be his kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Summary of the Law

We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings;
the remembrance of them is grievous unto us, the burden of them is intolerable.
Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father;
for your Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past;
and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please you in newness of life,
to the honor and glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Celebrant stands and says

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.





The Order of Confirmation

All that are to be confirmed, being placed, and standing in order before the Bishop

The Church requires that all who come to Confirmation and Reception should know the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments; and have a basic understanding of the Christian Faith as received in the Church.

We intend to administer the laying on of hands to these persons who by baptism are members of Christ's Church are prepared for Confirmation through instruction and prayer.

First, because it is evident from the Holy Scripture that the Apostles laid their hands upon those who were baptized; and this practice has been continued in the Church since the Apostles' time and has been judged agreeable to the Holy Scriptures.

Secondly, so that persons, having come to the years of discretion, may acknowledge publicly the vows made at their Baptism, and dedicate their lives to serving our Lord Jesus Christ.

Thirdly, in order that by prayer and the laying on of hands, they may be strengthened by the Holy Spirit, courageously to fight under the banner of Christ crucified, against sin, the world and the devil, and to continue Christ's faithful soldiers and servants to the end of their lives.

Then shall the Bishop say,

Do you here, in the presence of God, and of this Congregation, renew the solemn promise and vow that was made in your name or by you at your Baptism?

And every one shall audibly answer,

I do.

Bishop Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against

God?

Candidates I renounce them.

Bishop Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and

destroy the creatures of God?

Candidates I renounce them.

Bishop Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?

Candidates I renounce them.

Bishop Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

Candidates I do.

Bishop Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old

and New Testaments?

Candidates I do.

Bishop Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the

days of your life?

Candidates I will, the Lord being my helper.

The Bishop addresses the Congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

The Congregation responds

We will.

Then shall the Bishop say,

Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

Who has made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the Name of the Lord;

From this time forward, world without end.

Lord, hear our prayers.

And let our cry come unto you.

Let us pray.

Almighty and ever-living God, by whose grace these your servants have been born again by water and the Holy Spirit, and have received forgiveness of all their sins: confirm and strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, and daily increase in them your various gifts of grace; the spirit of

wisdom and understanding; the spirit of guidance and strength; the spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and fill them, O Lord, with the spirit of your holy fear, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Then all of them in order kneeling before the Bishop, he shall lay his hand upon the head of every one severally, saying,

Confirm and defend, O Lord, these your servants, *N*. with your heavenly grace, that *he/she* may continue yours forever; and daily increase in your Holy Spirit, more and more, until *he/she* comes to your everlasting kingdom. **Amen**.

For Reception

Those who have been confirmed in other Christian traditions are Received into the Anglican Church in North America and the Diocese of the Living Word

N. we recognize you as a member of the One, Holy, catholic, and Apostolic Church; and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and empower you.

People Amen.

Almighty and ever-living God, who makes us both to will and to do those things that are good and acceptable to your divine Majesty; We humbly pray for these your servants, upon whom (after the example of thy holy Apostles) we have now laid our hands, to assure them (by this sign) of your favor and gracious goodness towards them. Let your fatherly hand, we pray, be over them; let your Holy Spirit always be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your Word, that in the end they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with you and the Holy Spirit live and reign, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

Almighty and everlasting God, be pleased, we pray, to direct, sanctify, and govern both our hearts and bodies, in the ways of your laws, and in the obeying of your commandments; and grant that, through your most mighty protection, we may be preserved in body and soul, now and always; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Then the Bishop shall bless them, saying thus,

Be of good courage; hold fast to that which is good; render to no person evil for evil; strengthen the fainthearted; support the weak; help the afflicted; honor all people; love and serve the Lord, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit.

And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you, and remain with you, always. **Amen.**

The Peace

Celebrant The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And with your spirit.

Then the Celebrants and People may greet one another in the name of the Lord.

The text: Locus iste a Deo factus est, inaestimabile sacramentum, irreprehensibilis est.


Translation: This place is made by God It is profoundly sacred. God's work is beyond reproach.



Ongoing Ministries

Thursday Evening Bible Study This study meets, directly after Shepherd's Bowl in the sacristy, and is studying the book of James.

Friday Morning Men's Bible Study meets at 6:30am for breakfast, study, and prayer. If you are interested, please email or text Matt or Jonathan, or contact the church office. This class is currently in the Book of Daniel.

Women's Bible Study meets at 4:30pm on Friday afternoons in the Parish Hall. They are currently studying the book of Luke. Text Anne for a zoom link if you can't make it in person.

Morning Prayer meets online by Zoom at 7am Monday through Friday. The liturgy and readings are available at www.dailyoffice2019.com. Join the parish email list and look for a weekly email invitation in your inbox.

Home Groups meet weekly around the Binghamton area. They study the readings for the Sunday coming up, pray, and build relationships. Check in with Jonathan or Joe Kovac to get connected.

Good Shepherd Youth Group meets Sundays at 6pm and are studying the book of Revelation. This is an engaging context for kids to grow in

- 1) Knowledge of scripture and doctrine
- 2) Faithfulness to Christ
- 3) Service to others

Christian Education for Everyone

Children

For children aged 1-12 Good Shepherd offers Catechesis of the Good Shepherd—a program of prayer, worship, and scripture in specially prepared Montessori-style rooms—The Pen (1-3), The Pasture (3-6), The Vineyard (6-9), and The Tabernacle (7-12).

Teens

Teens aged 12 through 14 cover a range of topics—the Bible, Liturgy, Church History, Apologetics, the 39 Articles—in a three-year cycle. This is a discussion-style class that prepares kids for confirmation.

Adult Class

Discussion and study on topics ranging from Christian literature, the 39 articles, church history, difficult passages of the bible, and more.
