# The Nicene Creed

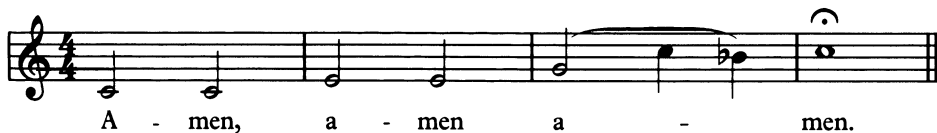

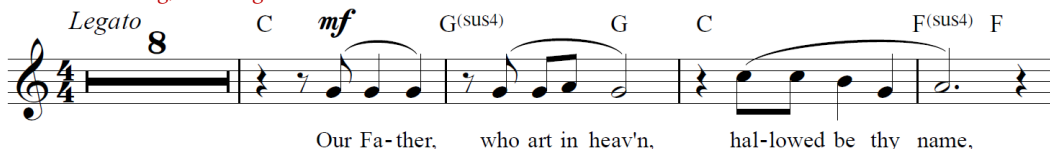

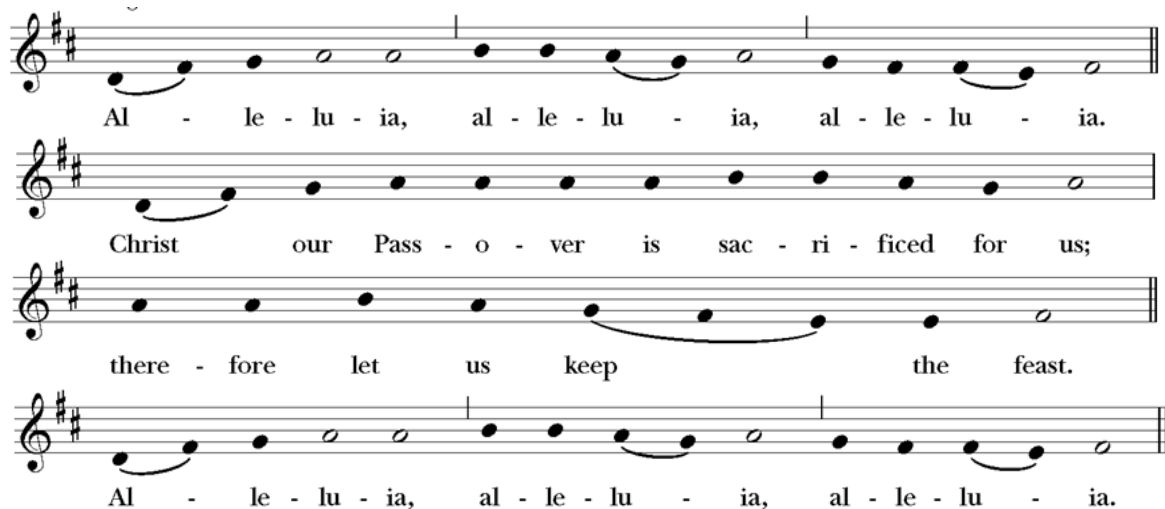
