

# The Nicene Creed

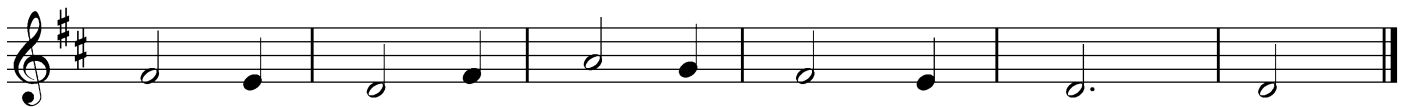

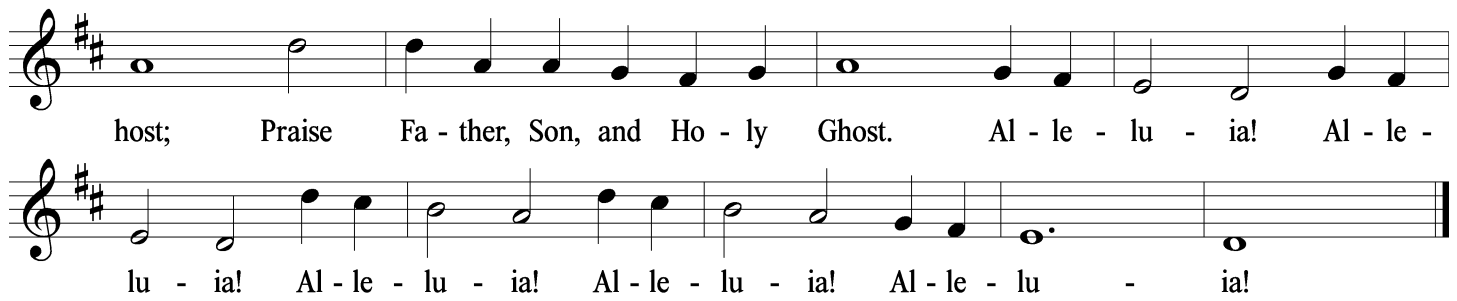

# The Prayer of Consecration

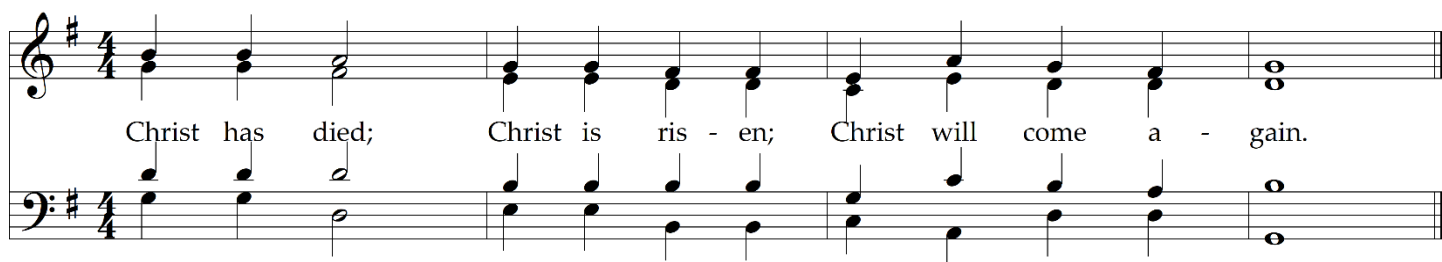

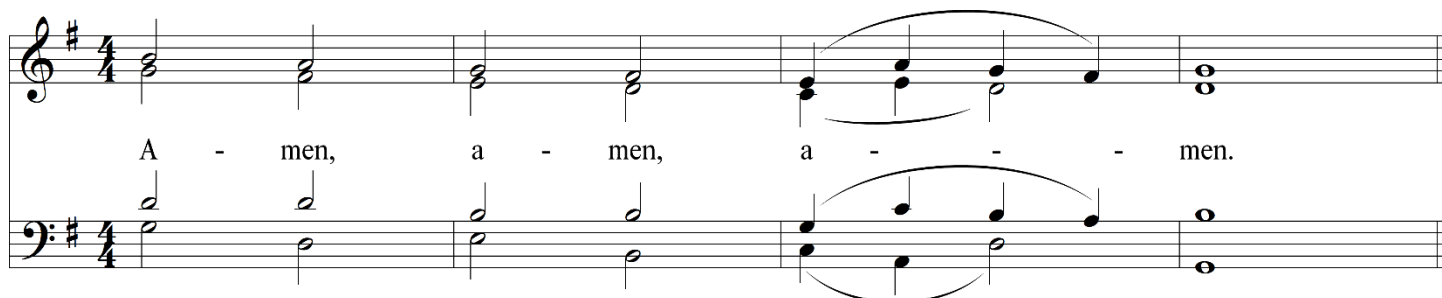

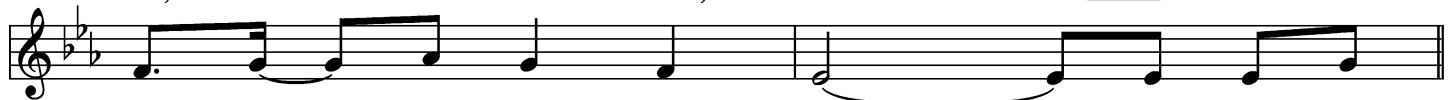
