



Celebrant Let us confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed:







Long-Term Food Storage & Beginner Vegetable Gardening Classes Jenn Fowler, a newer member of Good Shepherd, is certified as a Master Food Preserver through Cornell Cooperative Extension and has offered to teach two courses for anyone interested, as we face uncertain times within the economic and food supply systems.
