**The Prayer of Consecration**

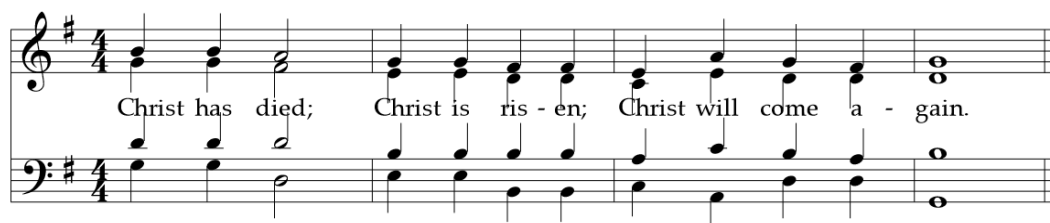
