If you are not an Anglican and would like to be one, Confirmation is the way to do that. If you have already been Confirmed in another denomination but would like to become an Anglican, the bishop will also be doing Receptions. Because people live far distances from Good Shepherd, the classes will be held over Zoom and they will all be recorded.
