# The Summary of the Law

Jesus said: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.

# The Confession of Sin

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

# The Baptism

**B**rothers and Sisters in Christ, the Sacrament of Baptism is offered in the Church because our Lord Jesus Christ taught us that we cannot enter the kingdom of God unless we are born anew of water and the Holy Spirit. This new birth is necessary because all human beings have both an inclination towards evil and are also sinners. Therefore, I urge you to call upon God the Father, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that in his great mercy he will grant new birth to this Child that she may be baptized with water and the Holy Spirit, and received into Christ's holy Church and be made a living member of the same.

Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting God, you who mercifully saved Noah and his family in the Ark when the great flood came, who safely led the children of Israel through the Red Sea, symbolizing thereby your holy Baptism, and who, by the Baptism in the river Jordan your dearly loved Son, Jesus Christ, sanctified water to the mystical washing away of sin: We pray you, in your infinite mercy, to look on this Child, wash and sanctify her by the Holy Spirit, in order that, being delivered from your wrath, she may be received into the Ark of Christ's Church. Make her we pray, to be steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, so that passing through the stormy waters of this troubled world, she may finally come to the land of everlasting life, there to reign with you forever; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

Almighty and immortal God, giver of aid to the needy, strength to the helpless, and everlasting life to those who believe, we pray for this Child who is coming to your holy Baptism, that she may receive forgiveness of her sins by spiritual regeneration.

Receive her, as you have promised by your dearly beloved Son in the Gospel, and make her to come to the eternal kingdom, which you have promised by him who is the Resurrection and the Life, even Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, since we are now persuaded of the good will of our heavenly Father towards this Child, declared by his Son Jesus Christ, let us faithfully and devoutly give thanks to him and say together,

Almighty and everlasting God, heavenly Father, we humbly thank you for having called us to the knowledge of your grace and to faith in you. Increase this knowledge and confirm this faith in us evermore. Give your Holy Spirit to this Child, that she may be born again, and be made an heir of everlasting salvation; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Then the Parents and Godparents shall stand at the font and the Minister says,

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, you have brought this child to be baptized, you have prayed that our Lord Jesus Christ would be pleased to receive, to cleanse, to sanctify, and to make her an heir of the kingdom of heaven and everlasting life. You have heard that our Lord Jesus Christ has promised in the Gospel all these things and we know that he will surely keep his promises.

The Minister asks the Godparents the following question,

Do you in the name of this child renounce the devil and all his works, the vain show and glory of this world, with all its covetousness, and the sinful desires of human nature, so that you will not follow nor be led by them? Answer: I renounce them all. Do you believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? And in Jesus Christ, his only begotten Son, our Lord? And that he was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary; that he suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and buried; that he descended into hell; and on the third day rose again; that he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; and from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead?

And do you believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting?

Answer: All this I steadfastly believe.

Minister. Do you desire to be baptized in this Faith?

Answer: That is my desire.

Minister. Will you keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the days of your life?

Answer: I will with God's help.

Let us pray.

Merciful God, grant that this Child die to sin, be buried and rise again to eternal life in and with Jesus Christ. **Amen.** 

Grant that all sinful desires may die in this Child, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in her. **Amen.** 

Grant that she may have power and strength by faith to have victory, and to triumph against the devil, the world and sinful human nature. **Amen.** 

Grant that whoever here begins to be a member of your flock may continue in the same forever. **Amen.** 

Grant that whoever here is dedicated to you by our office and ministry may also be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through your mercy, blessed Lord, who lives and governs all things, forever and ever. **Amen.** 

F ather, almighty and everlasting God, whose most dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of our sins, shed from his most precious side at the Cross both water and blood; and later gave commandment to his disciples, that they should go teach the all nations and baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit: Hear the prayer of your people; sanctify this water to the mystical washing away of sin; and grant that this Child now to be baptized in it, may receive the fullness of your grace, and ever remain in the number of your faithful and elect children; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

*Then the Minister shall take the child into his hands and shall say to the Godparents,* Name this child.

*The Minister pours water over the candidate saying,* Evelyn, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

We receive this Child into the congregation of Christ's flock, and sign her with the sign of the Cross, in token that from this time forward she shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and courageously to fight under his banner against sin, the world and the devil; and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant until her life's end. **Amen.** 

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, now that this Child has received the Sacrament of new birth and been received into the family of Christ's Church, let us give thanks unto Almighty God for these benefits; and with one accord make our prayers unto him, that this Child may lead the rest of her Christian life according to this good beginning.

**G**rant, Lord, that being buried with Christ by baptism into his death, this Child may also be made partaker of his resurrection; so that serving you on earth in newness of life, she may finally, with the rest of your holy Church, be an inheritor of your everlasting kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

When a child has been baptized, the Minister, speaking to the Parents and Godparents, says the following Exhortation. Since this Child has promised by you her guarantors to renounce the devil and all his works, to believe in God, and to serve him; you must remember, that it is your part and duty to see that this Child is taught, as soon as she is able to learn, what a solemn vow, promise, and profession, she has made here by you. And that she may know these things the better, you shall expect her to hear sermons; and to make sure that she learns the Apostles Creed, the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and all other things that a Christian ought to know and believe for their soul's health; and that this Child may be virtuously brought up to lead a godly and a Christian life; remembering always that Baptism is the sign of our profession; which is to follow the example of our Savior Christ, and to be made like him; that, as he died and rose again for us, so should we who are baptized, die from sin and rise again to righteousness; continually putting to death all our evil and corrupt desires, and to continue daily in all virtue and godliness of living.

# **Confirmation and Reception**

All that are to be confirmed, being placed, and standing in order before the Bishop

The Church requires that all who come to Confirmation and Reception should know the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments; and have a basic understanding of the Christian Faith as received in the Church.

We intend to administer the laying on of hands to these persons who by baptism are members of Christ's Church are prepared for Confirmation through instruction and prayer.

First, because it is evident from the Holy Scripture that the Apostles laid their hands upon those who were baptized; and this practice has been continued in the Church since the Apostles' time and has been judged agreeable to the Holy Scriptures.

Secondly, so that persons, having come to the years of discretion, may acknowledge publicly the vows made at their Baptism, and dedicate their lives to serving our Lord Jesus Christ.

Thirdly, in order that by prayer and the laying on of hands, they may be strengthened by the Holy Spirit, courageously to fight under the banner of Christ crucified, against sin, the world and the devil, and to continue Christ's faithful soldiers and servants to the end of their lives.

Then shall the Bishop say,

Do you here, in the presence of God, and of this Congregation, renew the solemn promise and vow that was made in your name or by you at your Baptism?

And every one shall audibly answer, **I do.** 

Then shall the Bishop say,

Our help is in the Name of the Lord; Who has made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the Name of the Lord; From this time forward, world without end.

Lord, hear our prayers. And let our cry come unto you.

Let us pray.

Almighty and ever-living God, by whose grace these your servants have been born again by water and the Holy Spirit, and have received forgiveness of all their sins: confirm and strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, and daily increase in them your various gifts of grace; the spirit of wisdom and understanding; the spirit of guidance and strength; the spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and fill them, O Lord, with the spirit of your holy fear, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

Then all of them in order kneeling before the Bishop, he shall lay his hand upon the head of every one severally, saying,

Confirm and defend, O Lord, these your servants, Rowan and Talitha with your heavenly grace, that he/she may continue yours forever; and daily increase in your Holy Spirit, more and more, until he/she comes to your everlasting kingdom. **Amen**.

### For Reception

Those who have been confirmed in other Christian traditions are Received into the Anglican Church in North America and the Diocese of the Living Word

Timothy, Claudia, and Peggy we recognize you as a member of the One, Holy, Catholic, andApostolic Church; and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God the Father,the Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and empower you.PeopleAmen.

Almighty and ever-living God, who makes us both to will and to do those things that are good and acceptable to your divine Majesty; We humbly pray for these your servants, upon whom (after the example of thy holy Apostles) we have now laid our hands, to assure them (by this sign) of your favor and gracious goodness towards them. Let your fatherly hand, we pray, be over them; let your Holy Spirit always be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your Word, that in the end they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with you and the Holy Spirit live and reign, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.** 

Almighty and everlasting God, be pleased, we pray, to direct, sanctify, and govern both our hearts and bodies, in the ways of your laws, and in the obeying of your commandments; and grant that, through your most mighty protection, we may be preserved in body and soul, now and always; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.** 

Then the Bishop shall bless them, saying thus,

Be of good courage; hold fast to that which is good; render to no person evil for evil; strengthen the fainthearted; support the weak; help the afflicted; honor all people; love and serve the Lord, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit. And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you, and remain with you, always. **Amen.**

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."
