## The Nicene Creed

**W**e believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. Who, with the Father and the Son, is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets.

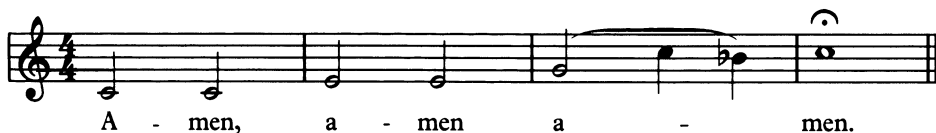

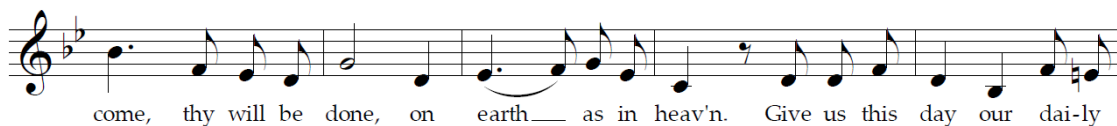
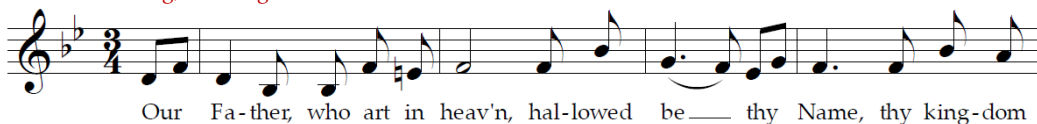
