The Liturgy of the Palms

CelebrantHosanna to the Son of David, the King of Israel.PeopleBlessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Dear brothers and sisters, from the beginning of Lent until now we have been preparing our hearts by repentance and self-sacrifice. Today, with the whole Church, we herald the beginning of the celebration of the Paschal Mystery. On this day our Lord Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem and was welcomed as King with palms and shouts of praise. Today we greet him as our King, though we know his crown was a crown of thorns, and his throne a cross.

Therefore, I invite you to follow our Lord this Holy Week, from his triumphal entry, through his suffering and death, to the glory of his resurrection.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. *Amen.*



	been wanting to see him. From what he had heard about him, he hoped to see
	him perform some miracle. He plied him with many questions, but Jesus gave

	him. Dressing him in an elegant robe, they sent him back to Pilate. That day
	Herod and Pilate became friends—before this they had been enemies. Pilate
	called together the chief priests, the rulers and the people, and said to them,
Pilate	"You brought me this man as one who was inciting the people to rebellion. I have
	examined him in your presence and have found no basis for your charges
	against him. Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us; as you can see, he has
	done nothing to deserve death. Therefore, I will punish him and then release
	him."
Narrator	With one voice they cried out,
Congregation	"Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us!"

Luke 23:1-49(NIV)

Narrator	(Barabbas had been thrown into prison for an insurrection in the city, and for murder.) Wanting to release Jesus, Pilate appealed to them again. But they kept shouting,
Congregation	"Crucify him! Crucify him!"
Narrator	For the third time he spoke to them:
Pilate	"Why? What crime has this man committed? I have found in him no grounds for
	the death penalty. Therefore I will have him punished and then release him."
Narrator	But with loud shouts they insistently demanded that he be crucified, and their
	shouts prevailed. So Pilate decided to grant their demand. He released the man
	who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, the one they
	asked for, and surrendered Jesus to their will.

Narrator	As they led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on his way in
	from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind
	Jesus. A large number of people followed him, including women who mourned
	and wailed for him. Jesus turned and said to them,
Jesus	"Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your

- esus Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. For the time will come when you will say, 'Blessed are the barren women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' Then they will say to the mountains, "Fall on us!" and to the hills, "Cover us!" For if men do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry?"
- Narrator Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with him to be executed. When they came to the place called the Skull, there they crucified him, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said, Jesus "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Narrator And they divided up his clothes by casting lots. The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, Ruler "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One." Narrator The soldiers also came up and mocked him. They offered him wine vinegar and said. Soldier "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." Narrator: There was a written notice above him, which read: THIS IS THE KING OF THE IEWS. One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: Criminal 1: "Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us!"
- Narrator: But the other criminal rebuked him.

Criminal 2: "Don't you fear God,"

Narrator: Criminal 2:	he said, "since you are under the same sentence? We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."
Narrator:	Then he said,
Criminal 2:	"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."
Narrator:	Jesus answered him,
Jesus:	"I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise."
Narrator:	It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the whole land until
	the ninth hour, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was
	torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice,
Jesus	"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit."
Narrator	When he had said this, he breathed his last.
	The centurion, seeing what had happened, praised God and said,
Centurion	"Surely this was a righteous man."
Narrator	When all the people who had gathered to witness this sight saw what took place, they beat their breasts and went away. But all those who knew him, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching
	these things.




The Offertory Sentence

All praise and glory is yours, O God our heavenly Father, for in your tender mercy, you gave your only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption. He made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and he instituted, and in his Holy Gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

And now, O merciful Father; in your great goodness, we ask you to bless and sanctify, with your Word and Holy Spirit, these gifts of bread and wine, that we, receiving them according to

your Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

For on the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me." 


