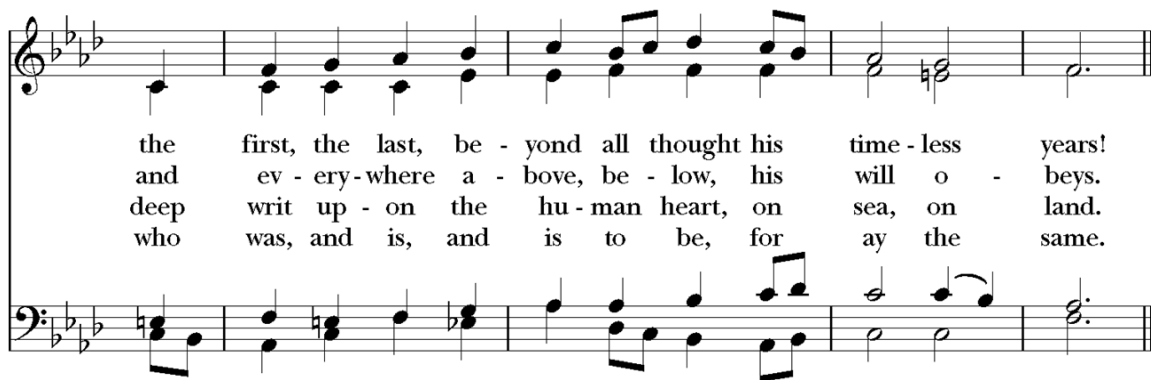

# The Nicene Creed

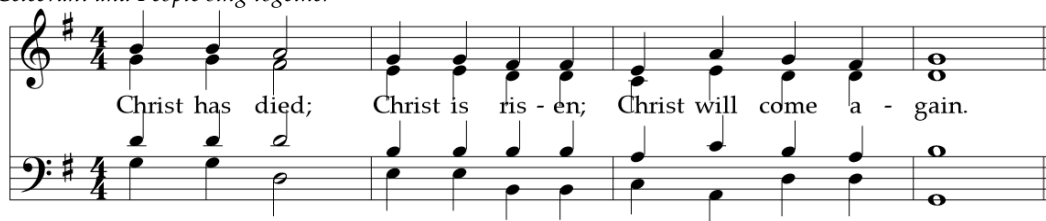

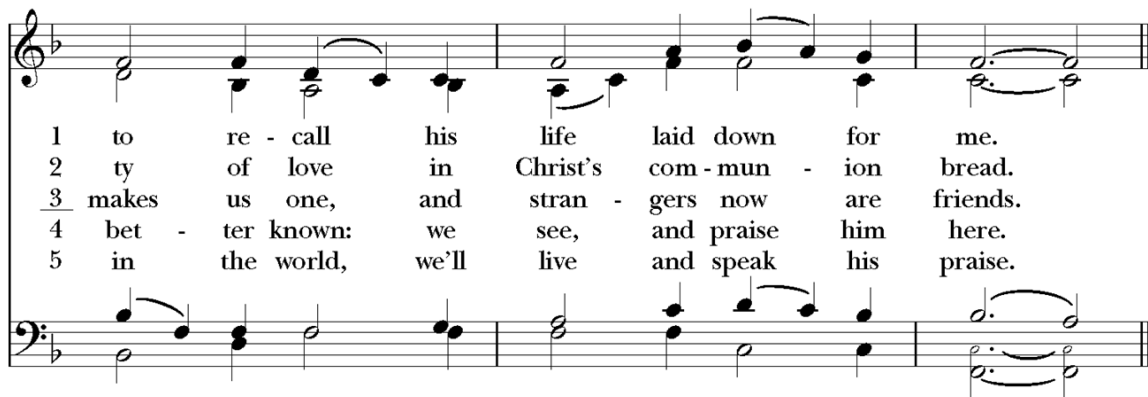
