Holy Baptism

Following the sermon, the candidates with their sponsors stand before the Celebrant.

The Exhortation

Celebrant

Dearly beloved, Scripture teaches that we were all dead in our sins and trespasses. Our Savior Jesus Christ said, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God," and he commissioned the Church to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Therefore we will ask our heavenly Father that David, being baptized with water, may be received as living members of Christ's holy Church.

The Presentation

Celebrant	The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.
Sponsors	I present David Stuart to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant then addresses candidate

Celebrant	Have you already been baptized?
Candidate	No.
Celebrant	Do you desire to be baptized?
Candidate	I do.

Profession of Faith

The celebrant examines the candidate

Question	Do you renounce the Devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Question	Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Question	Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?
Answer	I renounce them.

The Celebrant shall pray over the Candidate

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil, and lead you into the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

The Celebrant continues

Question	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of
	the Old and New Testaments?
Answer	I do.
Question	Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them
	all the days of your life?
Answer	I will, the Lord being my helper.
The Celebrant then addresses the congregation, first inviting them to stand.	

CelebrantWill you who witness these vows do all in your power to support David in his
life in Christ?PeopleWe will.

The Celebrant then says

Let us join with David to proclaim our faith in the words of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?
I do.
I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?
I do.
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the Holy
Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was
crucified, died, and was buried: He descended to the dead. On the third day he
rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the
Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?
I do.
I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Amen.

Prayer for the Candidate

Celebrant Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, prefiguring the work of Christ, the Ark of our Salvation. Look mercifully upon this your servant. Wash and sanctify him through your Holy Spirit, that he may be delivered from the power and penalty of sin; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, he may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Thanksgiving Over the Water

The Celebrant pours the water for baptism.

Celebrant	The Lord be with you.
People	And with your spirit.
Celebrant People	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is just and right so to do.

The Celebrant continues

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan when the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are united to his visible Body, the Church. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Here the Celebrant touches the water and says

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. May all who are baptized here continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The Baptism

Then the Celebrant pours water upon the candidate three times, saying David, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The Celebrant makes the sign of the Cross upon the forehead of the newly baptized David, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. *Amen.*

The baptismal candle is now presented, and the Celebrant says

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by the shed blood of Jesus Chris you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, received him as your own child by adoption, made him a member of your Church, and raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit, that he may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

The Celebrant continues

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People We receive you into the fellowship of the Church. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in the royal priesthood of all his people.

The Peace

CelebrantThe peace of the Lord be always with you.PeopleAnd with your spirit.Then the Celebrants and People may greet one another in the name of the Lord.

The Prayer of Consecration

The people kneel. The Celebrant continues

All praise and glory is yours, God our heavenly Father, because of your tender mercy, you gave your only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and instituted, and in his Holy Gospel commanded us to continue a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

And now, O merciful Father; in your great goodness, we ask you to bless and sanctify, with your Word and Holy Spirit, these gifts of bread and wine, that we, receiving them according to your Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith

Celebrant and People together

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again

And here we offer and present to you, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice; humbly pleading that all those who shall partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ; that, by the Holy Spirit, we may be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, so that he may dwell in us, and we in him. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. *Amen.*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

The Lord's Prayer

The people remain kneeling

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The Fraction

Celebrant	Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.
People	Therefore let us keep the feast.

The Prayer of Humble Access

Celebrant and people say together

We do not presume to come to this your Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your Table. But you are the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. *Amen.*

*dona nobis pacem = grant us peace

The Communion of the People

All Christians baptized in any denomination are welcome to take Communion. If you are not a Christian or are unbaptized, you are warmly invited to the rail for a prayer and blessing: just place your hands across your chest and one of the pastors will bless and pray for you. If you are in a wheelchair or are unable to come forward for any reason, please let an usher know and we will bring the Sacrament to you in your pew. Gluten free wafers are available.

Celebrant

The gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The Post Communion Prayer

Almighty and ever-living God, we thank you for feeding us, in these holy mysteries, with the spiritual food of the most precious Body and Blood of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ; and for assuring us, through this Sacrament, of your favor and goodness towards us; and that we are true members of the mystical body of your Son, the blessed company of all faithful people; and are also heirs, through hope, of your everlasting kingdom. And we humbly ask you, heavenly Father, to assist us with your grace, that we may continue in that holy fellowship, and do all such good works as you have prepared for us to walk in; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. Amen.
